

We frequently say that Freemasonry is a system of morality, veiled in allegory, and illustrated by symbols. Each Masonic organization uses symbols as teaching tools to build the character of its members. The importance of symbols to our Fraternity is clear, but the use of these symbols to guide our daily life is not as clear. The following passage from the 32nd degree shows the difference between the importance of Masonic symbolism and its lack of daily use: "Some join Freemasonry out of idle mere curiosity, some because it may profit them in their business affairs or secure them aid in distress. Others seek to learn our supposed mysteries or to acquire the titles, decorations, and distinctions Masonry confers. Many are satisfied with Masonic rites or Degrees that are shadows and teach nothing of value. Few care for the great truths of Masonic philosophy or become interested in the study of its ancient symbols."

Freemasonry does not impose on its members one set of interpretation of its symbols. It leaves it up to each of us to interpret these symbols. This freedom has perhaps left some confused, and as a result, many of us do not know how to use these symbols as a guide. I would like to share a process with you that might help us "figure it out". First, it is important to recognize the fact these symbols can have different meanings to each individual. For example, consider a picture of a lake and some trees. This may remind one person of a vacation in the forest, another might think of a fishing trip, another may remember a hunting trip, and yet to another it may signify peace and solitude. Therefore, with that in mind, we can use the following four-step process:

- Step 1 Select a symbol
- Step 2 Study the symbol you select
- Step 3 Determine what the symbol means to you
- Step 4 Use the symbol in your daily life

First, select a symbol that interest you. It can be any symbol for any reason. I know a Brother who was in the Navy, so he selected for his first symbol the anchor. Next, study the symbol. Read what others have written about it, and discuss it with other Masons. Third, think about what this symbol means to you. This could be consistent with some description in the ritual or something someone else said or wrote about it, but it also could be completely different. The important thing is that the meaning you select has significance to you. As you ponder and study the symbol, it will gradually take on a meaning that is of particular significance to you. This makes it readily available in your mind for application should a situation occur that allows it. Finally, we should always seek to use the symbol in assisting us. This may be the hardest of the four steps, but the first three are meaningless if you do not actually use the symbol to make a difference in your daily life. The Brother, who was in the

Brethren, the letter below from a parent can better explain what our program has done to change lives. Please read it carefully. This explains why I enjoy and love working with this program. This is the best reward a program can receive. Thank you for your continual support of our Early Speech & Language Program. **Ill. Lawrence T. Newsham, 33**⁰

I am writing to say thank you and share our story of how Early Life Speech & Language changed our lives. Please feel free to share and use our story if desired. My daughter, Elliott, graduated from Early Life Speech & Language about 3 years ago. It's amazing to think that the girl that once could only say "bus bus", when trying to communicate, is now the one telling long stories and consistently talking to imaginary pets and people.

Elliott was enrolled with two other speech therapists before we found Early Life Speech & Language. It was a difficult time for our family. The toddler years are hard enough, but constantly teaching boundaries and appropriate behavior to a child, who couldn't communicate back with us, was painful. When she would get upset, she would just let out a scream. Besides our frustration, there was heartbreaks. On one occasion, we were out shopping. She was in the cart having trouble controlling her volume. She was loudly "singing" even though it didn't sound like a song. Someone came up to us and told her to be quiet. Many people stared when all she was trying to do was sing. I watched her at the park not able to say her name to other kids. I saw the other kids' reaction when they couldn't understand what she was saying. At this point, I knew I had to be an advocate. I had to fight. I had to educate myself.

I was desperately searching the Internet for resources when I cam across Early Life Speech & Language. I couldn't believe that there were free classes. I quickly called and got enrolled for the next session. I was ecstatic to find such a resource. Jackie taught the classes we attended and it was taught in such a way that made sense. To this day, I can still remember the lessons she taught and still use them with my younger children. We also enjoyed being with other parents realizing we were not alone.. The classes empowered us and gave us hope.

I remember when Elliott had her first evaluation with Jackie. Elliott just kept saying "bus" and not much more. I kept looking at Jackie waiting for her reaction. She wasn't scared or alarmed. A few days after our first meeting with Jackie, we were driving and heard Elliott said two new words which I heard Jackie say during the evaluation. I couldn't believe it. After over a half a year with other private speech therapists without much progress, Elliott was saying two new words after less than an hour with Jackie!

Jackie always allowed Elliott to be herself, celebrated her personality and made her feel accepted and confident. Elliott truly flourished because of Jackie. The beginning of our speech delay journey was difficult, seeming hopeless at times. Early Life Speech & Language became the light in our journey. Elliott was taught by one of the best speech therapists there is. The education classes were priceless. Jackie will always hold a special place in our hearts. She gave our little girl a voice. Your program truly changed our lives. Thank you for everything you do.

Scottish Rite Masonic Education

SCOTTISH CHEMISTRY - Survey of Alchemical Symbols in the Lodge of Perfection of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite. Part 3

11th Degree I do not find any explicit symbolic references to Alchemy in this degree

12th degree

Hanging in the east in the 12th degree we find a six pointed star comprised of two triangles interlaced. One triangle is white, the other black[42]. In alchemy, the upright triangle represents fire, and the upside-down triangle is the symbol for water. Together they symbolize the unity of opposites. The number 6 represents balance and beauty. To the reader I suggest you consider the directions pointed at by each the triangles for further understanding.

On the north side of the room we find a diagram with the North Star and the seven stars of the big dipper. The concept of seven stars has Alchemistic meanings. The big dipper, while the most recognized grouping of stars is not really by itself a constellation. It is part of the constellation Ursa Major, or the Great Bear. The big dipper forms the rump and the tail of the bear[43]. I have found some connections with the North Star representing the chi or life force of our world, and the big dipper revolving around the North Star representing the seven immortals. This connection to ancient Alchemy is rather speculative, so I am not ready to commit to it.

A closer connection to Alchemy would point to the seven stars as possibly representing the seven Chakras[44], or the seven spiritual energies. The Alchemists called the Chakras the seals of the planets. A Chakra represents energy centers located at various points on the body. Shown below is a table relating the planets, their Alchemical metal, body location, and the corresponding Chakra[45].

Course I

Course II

It returns to the texts from the first program in nine quizzes and re-explores the ritual on a deeper level, looking for the moral lesson imparted in each degree and then applying that lesson to one's everyday life.

Course III

The Scottish Rite Master Craftsman: Symbolic Lodge course will familiarize students with aspects of the development of Blue Lodge Masonry and explore some of its developing symbolism. This will reveal that the "High Degrees" began to develop soon after formation of the Premier Grand Lodge (1717).

Each course consists of 7 quizzes, after completion of which the participant will receive a certificate and a lapel pin.

Scottish Rite Masonic Education

The seven stars may also represent the seven Hermetic principles found in the Kybalion[46]. These seven principles are Mentalism, Correspondence, Vibration, Polarity, Rhythm, Cause and Effect, Gender.

13th and 14th Degree

We will take the 13th and 14th degree together, as they are in many ways sister degrees. We have already explored the Hermetic connection with the vault of the 13th and 14th degree, so we will not repeat that here. The script for the 13th degree is the only one in the Lodge of Perfection that explicitly states a connection to alchemy. In the introduction read to the class the degree states, "The cubicle Stone, an ancient Masonic symbol...This symbol is also found in the Hebrew and Christian scriptures. From here it was introduced into Alchemy, and from there, into Freemasonry[47]". To the Alchemist the symbol of the cube may represent salt, one of the basic substances. The cube, with its six sides plus the point in the center, corresponds to the seven days of creation. If you connect the corners of each side of the cube diagonally you can see four triangles, symbolic of the four Alchemic elements (salt, sulfur, mercury, and azoth). The Alchemists declare that salt was the first created substance, produced by fire that flowed out of God. In salt is the creation concentrated, the beginning and end of all things[48]. Why the reference to Alchemy is explicitly called out here in our ritual, and not elsewhere, is not known.

In both the 13th and 14th degree we see the cubical stone with a plate of solid gold. The plate of gold resembles the plate on the altar of the tomb (or secret vault) of Father CRC of the Rosicrucian's[49]. The element gold is also an Alchemistic element, and very symbolic of the final desired state of transmutation. The reader may wish to observe what side of the cube the plate of gold is affixed to for further understanding.

The battery of both the 13th and 14th degree is 3x3. Alchemy is a three fold art, symbolically represented in 3x3; three elements in three worlds, the divine, the human, and the elemental. The 3x3 also represents the number 9, the number of esoteric man and the number of emanations from the root of Devine[50]. One can immediately see connections with the nine arches of the vault in the 13th and 14th degree, as well as the nine names of God given on each arch.

In the 14th degree in front of the Senior Warden is a seven candelabra, which should bring to mind the tree of life, as shown in figure 1. In the ritual we are told this candelabrum specially represents the seven planets that of Saturn, Jupiter, Mars, Venus, Mercury and the Moon, with the Sun as the highest candle in the center[51]. It should be obvious by now the connection to Alchemy and what this symbol represents. Perhaps it is fitting to end the Lodge of Perfection with the planetary symbols, which to the Alchemist would represent the "above", the final accent into the heavens.

In exploring the symbols throughout the Lodge of Perfection we have seen examples of very strong Hermetic connection, and in some cases the connection





has been more tenuous. However, it is apparent, at least to this researcher that the influence of Alchemy that began in the symbolic lodge has continued throughout the Scottish Rite Lodge of Perfection[52]. The brief symbolic explanations given here have probably left the reader somewhat wanting. There is a staggering amount of detail and interpretation behind each of the Alchemistical symbols we uncovered and I must leave further exploration to the reader. I am reminded of the Hermetic adage, that whoever attempts a literal understanding of the teachings of the Hermetic philosophers will lose himself in the many twist and turns of the labyrinth from which he will never find his way out[53]. I hope that this brief paper has brought to light the rich field of Alchemy symbolism in Masonry that has gone in many aspects largely untapped.

Now finally, what about the quest of the operative Alchemists to convert base metals into gold? Well, we can and have been able to accomplish this. It is possible to take base elements such as tin and copper and combine them to create gold. Oh, I forgot to mention, you will require the aid of a linear accelerator. This is used to speed the atoms of tin to 1/10th the speed of light and smash them into the copper atoms, fusing the nuclei together. It does produce atoms of gold, albeit at a fiendishly uneconomical cost[54]. While the modern chemist works to convert atomic structures, the speculative Alchemist works to turn the spiritual lead to spiritual gold in their path in refining their relationship with the Deity.






